The Village of Plover: The Village stated that several area businesses are planning to do expansions in 2013. Some of the expansions will be buildings, while others will be building and employee expansions. The county will now be able to take possession of ten of the thirteen Kennedy Property parcels. A permit for a dialysis center has been issued. Element Mobile will e the first tenant in the new Windsor Center. The Hwy HH/Hoover intersection will be completed by the end of October. The intersection of Hwy B/Hoover will be reconstructed in 2013. Hwy R between Hwy HH and Porter will be reconstructed in 2013, as well. TJ Maxx will be opening the end of October. The WOOT continues acquisitions along the Bus Hwy 51 corridor. The first phase of construction from Green Avenue to Springville Drive is slated for 2015 or 2016.

Portage County Planning & Zoning: The WDDT contract for a bike/pedestrian path in the Business Park is now official. The County will be meeting with the consultant. The county will be doing infrastructure analysis around all the schools in Portage county, both public and private. The county will also be doing a generalized infrastructure analysis in the urban area, as well as in all the rural areas.

Stevens Point Area Convention & Visitors Bureau: The CVB launched its Customer Service Video training. This training will enhance the customer service experience for people travelling to this area. The hope for this training is that local employers will integrate this into their staff training. The CVB is working on its 2013 marketing/budget plan. The CVB will begin selling ad and banner space for its 2013 Visitors Guide.

Board: The Board granted a student scholarship in its fiscal first quarter. The Board discussed upcoming events and ways to increase attendance at events. Board members will assist in setting up and working at the larger events. The directors approved the 2012-2013 budget.

PABA Business of the Year Del Monte Foods

Del Monte Foods is one of the country's largest and most well-known producers, distributors, and marketers of premium quality, branded food and pet products for the U.S. retail market, generating approximately \$3.7 billion in net sales in fiscal 2011.

With a powerful portfolio of brands, Del Monte products are found in eight out of ten U.S. households. Pet food and pet snacks brands include <u>Meow Mix®</u>, <u>Kibbles 'n Bits®</u>, <u>Milk-Bone®</u>, <u>9Lives®</u>, <u>Pup-Peroni®</u>, <u>Gravy Train®</u>, <u>Nature's Recipe®</u>, <u>Canine Carry Outs®</u>, <u>Milo's Kitchen®</u>, and other brand names. Food product brands include <u>Del Monte®</u>, <u>S&W®</u>, <u>Contadina®</u>, <u>College Inn®</u>, and other brand names. The Company also produces and distributes private label food and pet products.

Del Monte's facility in Plover was first constructed in 1965 and produced its first canned green beans in 1966. The plant was built in Plover because of its proximity to the Central Sands growing area and the ready access to this premier growing area. Since 1965, Del Monte has expanded its green bean operation numerous times and added capability to process Potatoes, Beets, and Carrots. Plover has grown to become the largest vegetable plant within the Del Monte Foods system. Today the plant processes tens of thousands of tons of raw vegetable products each year, employs 102 full-time people, and more than 500 seasonal employees each year.

Since its beginning, the Plover farm department has worked with the local growing community to provide vegetables for Del Monte plants in Wisconsin. Currently the farm group supplies raw product not only to the Plover plant but also to operations in Markesan and Cambria. The farm group currently supplies Peas, Sweet Corn, Green Beans, Wax Beans, Italian Beans, Beets, Carrots, and Potatoes to the three plants. Today Del Monte works with 94 growers here in Central Wisconsin to provide the bulk of these crops. Many of the growers have worked with Del Monte since the facility's inception in 1966.

Fred was born and raised on the eastside of Milwaukee. He graduated from the local high school and continued his education earning college credits in police work. Fred relocated to Central Wisconsin when he took a job as a police officer for the Stevens Point Police Department. He and his wife, Martina, felt this would be a great area to raise a family.

Fred served in the Marine Corps for three years. He worked for the Stevens Point Police Department for 30 years. During this time, Fred worked in various areas of the department including dispatch, court and training, range officer, SWAT leader, detective bureau, and traffic and parking. While in parking and traffic, Fred worked with the safety cadets in the schools and as Officer Friendly with the young students. As part of his job, he took the cadets to Washington D.C. and the Wisconsin Dells. Fred retired from the department in 1997 as a Lieutenant. After retirement, he worked at Saint Michael's Lab as a courier for 10 years. He also works as a bailiff in the Portage County Courts.

Fred was first named to the Village Board in 1989 to complete the term of another supervisor. He served in this position until 1991. Fred ran for Village Board again in 1997 and won. He has been serving his ward and community ever since. Fred was named as a citizen member of the Village's Employee Relations Negotiating Committee in 1996. 
